



European mortality bulletin week 14, 2012: The increased all-cause mortality among the 65+ year olds seems to have stopped. Excess mortality has been detected since week 6 until this week. Although data from week 14 and 13 are likely to be influenced by reporting delay, it appears that pooled mortality peaked in week 7-8 and has now normalised. The excess mortality concurs with increased influenza activity in Europe as well as with a cold snap that affected Europe in the beginning of February. The mortality peak in the 5-14 year age group in week 11 reflects the death of 21 Belgium children and some Swiss children in a tragic bus accident.
